

### **ATTENDANCE INFORMATION**

The Sayreville Board of Education believes that the regular attendance of students is critical to its educational mission. Research shows that student absences impact a child's ability to succeed in school. There is also evidence that chronic absenteeism from school is a primary cause of low academic achievement and a powerful predictor of a student's risk of dropping out of school.

The New Jersey Department of Education only allows 5 reasons for a school to report an absence as "excused" on a student's attendance record:

- 1. Religious observance;
- 2. College visit (grades 11&12);
- 3. Take Our Children to Work Day;
- 4. Observance of Veterans Day;
- Closure of a busing district that prevents a student from having transportation to the receiving school.

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# SUES STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Virtual Learning Edition

According to Sayreville Board of Education Policy #5113, as well as New Jersey Administrative Code 6A:32-8.3, students must be present for <u>4 hours of instruction</u> in order to be considered "present" for the day. This does not count lunch/recess.

Because we are currently using an early-dismissal schedule that has students attend school from 8:30am-1:00pm, which is 4 ½ hours and includes a 30 minute lunch period, students must be logged on to their class Google Meet or Webex video conference for the entire day in order to be present for 4 hours of instruction.

## Students that log on after 8:30 am or log off prior to 1:00 pm will be marked absent since they will not be present for 4 hours of instruction.

If there are extenuating circumstances, such as technology issues, that are preventing your child from being logged in to a Google Meet or Webex for the duration of the school day, please communicate the issue to your child's teacher via email as soon as possible.

### **MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS**

An appointment with a doctor should be made after 1:00 pm whenever possible to avoid your child being marked absent. If your child must log off during instructional hours for an appointment with a doctor, please send a photo/scan of the doctor's note to your child's teacher as soon as possible so that your child's absence can be logged appropriately.

<u>Please know that teacher office hours cannot take the place of instructional hours, nor can they be used to make up for lost time during the school day.</u>

According to Sayreville Board of Education Policy #5113 – Regardless if absences are listed as excused or unexcused in the policy, <u>a student</u> <u>must be in attendance for 162 or more school days</u> in order to be considered to have successfully completed the instructional program requirements of the grade to which he/she is assigned. <u>Failure to have</u> <u>attended at least 162 school days may result in student retention.</u>
